

Whale Watching: The Bay of Fundy is a world renowned gathering place for a number of species



of whales. Hump-backs, Minke, Fin-backs as well as Porpoises gather from late spring to early fall. Whale watching season runs from June to October.. We

work closely with all the leading whale watching companies operating out of Digby Neck and can recommend options based on your timings and preferences. Tour boats or Zodiacs are available.

Lighthouses: Nova Scotia's maritime history has left a legacy of lighthouses. Point Prim in Digby or Western Light on Bier Island are well worth visiting. Besides simply enjoying the view of the sea, you'll see crashing surf; lots of birds and other wildlife; you can watch fishing boats coming, going and hauling lobster traps and see the Fundy Rose ferry to New Brunswick steaming in and out of Digby Gut.

Tour Port Royal - a recreation of the original set-

tlement in this area. There are guides in costumes at the gate and then you can explore the buildings at your leisure. Take a

Walking Trails: Take a relaxing walk through the Harbourview Loop—along Harbourview Rd past the cottages until you find Jagger lane that loops back behind the Inn. About a 30 minute walk. Or follow the abandoned railway line



trail all the way to the Bear River lighthouse

Bear River: The home of local artists, only 10 minutes from the Inn. The award winning Flight of fancy gallery is a must.
