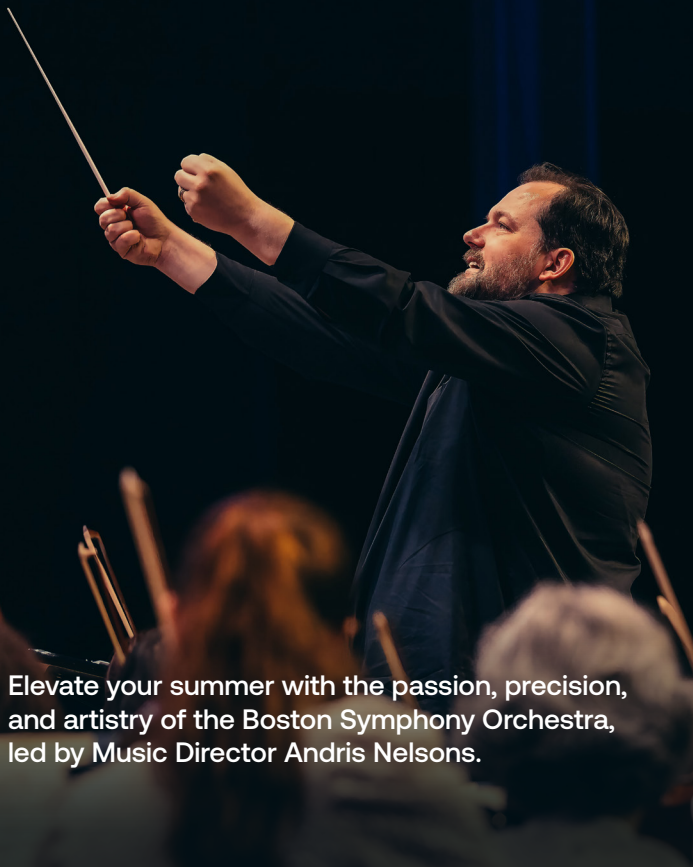

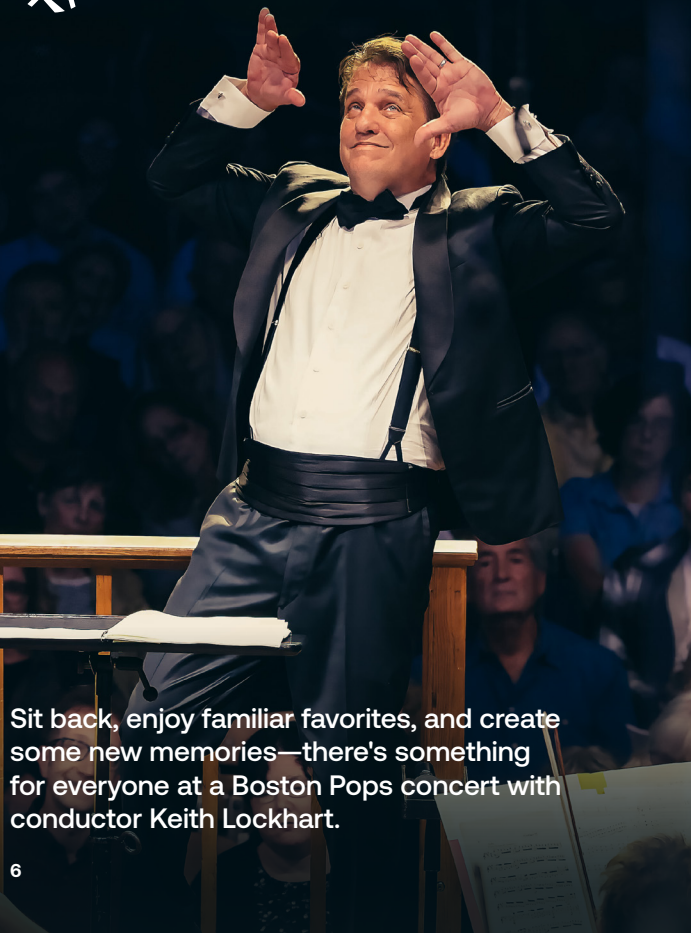

Season passes are not valid for Film Nights, the Popular Artist Series, or any TLI event.

Lawn Pass Book

A Lawn Pass Book is available for \$220 through June 7, 2024, and contains 11 lawn tickets valid for any regular- or specially-priced BSO and Pops concerts in the Koussevitzky Music Shed and Ozawa Hall. These tickets are not valid for Film Nights, the Popular Artist Series, or any TLI event.
