





Up to four free children's tickets are available per parent/legal guardian per concert at the Tanglewood Box Office on the day of the performance.

- To minimize disruptions, children under 5 are not permitted in the Shed during concerts (except for the Family Concert on July 21), but may enjoy the music on the lawn.
- All patrons, regardless of age, must have a ticket.
- This program does not apply to the Popular Artist Series, TLI events, or summer camps, field trips, or other organized groups.
