Despite many years of trying to obtain corporate sponsorships, grants, and even hosting the biggest and best Civil War event west of the Mississippi, we are lagging behind in our plan to be financially independent of some of our members (i.e. Dennis Winfrey). Therefore, I have begun to work on a plan to host a fund-raising dinner in Salinas on November 19, 2009. If successful, this will lay the groundwork for following years. This dinner will not be the end all to CHAS' financial struggles, but instead, a beginning. 
I look forward to continuing to work on our historical impression and working closely with the Captain and First Sgt to make our camp run efficiently and maximizing the fun that we have at an event.



2008 Death Valley Encounter Ride

In the time between Christmas and New Years I went with my family and my horse Farley to test my mettle against Death Valley. A 4 day race takes place every year with a distance each day of 50 or 25-30 miles. Being a wimp (or at least a little unsure of what my little but mighty steed was capable of) I rode each day at the "Limited Distance" (the 25-30 miles) option. I completed each of the four days for a grand total of 100-110 miles on horse back. My horse, Farley, kept getting stronger and stronger each day. The first camp was on BLM land in the middle of nowhere (just out of Trona?).



Day one was random loops through the We rode through the town of Johannesburg, a quaint little mining town. I felt like I was in the old west, complete with saloons, shacks, and mine shafts. I did most of the ride this day at the walk/trot. No need to get pulled for lameness the first day! Day two was a big loop around some local land marks and through We actually got to go through some snow! This day I did quite a bit of cantering, with a wee bit of galloping....After Day two we moved camp to the ghost town of Ballarat. We were camped right underneath the Panamint mountains. Day 3 was a random loop around Ballarat. I must admit to a fair amount of galloping through the desert.....How could I resist? Riding an Arabian through the desert....They are MADE for that! The constant half-halts to assess just how in control I still was, the jets over the flyaways showing off for us (the horses running out of control...) Day 4 riding was the best day. Camp was moved to Valley wells while the ridings took a historical pioneer route over a slate pass from Ballarat to Valley



wells. The trails were rocky with drop offs, similar to the Tevis trails. It was beautiful (although my eyes were closed for most of it). For those of you trying to convert miles to hours in the saddle, I spent ~15 hours in the saddle. For you artillery drivers, it is very possible to spend that amount of time on the team during an event. The difference being that I didn't have to sit and wait for anyone! My time was spent MOVING. Happy New Year everyone and a BIG thanks to all of my family members that went with me, especially my mom who made sure I didn't have to eat Ramen the entire time.
